**August 4 at 1 p.m. - Dating Old Photographs by Larry Keddy**

This lecture describes a photo research system that will provide the family historian with a set of guidelines to follow in establishing the time period when a photograph was taken.

**August 4 at 2:30 p.m. - Care and Preservation of Old Family Photographs by Larry Keddy**

Every photograph has a natural life span. This lecture describes the major factors that shorten the life of a photograph, and what the average homeowner can do to protect the family photo collection. Information will also be provided on the choice of photo albums, and common pitfalls to avoid in framing.

**August 5 at 9:30 a.m. - Preserving those Precious Artifacts by Karen White**

Now that you have uncovered some one-of-kind family treasures---pictures, letters, maybe even clothing...what are the easiest and economical methods for keeping them safe for future generations? This workshop will focus on practical tips on preserving family artifacts, and where to find archival-safe storage materials.

**August 5 at 11 a.m. - Living Family Tree by Pauline MacLean**

Present your family with a visual family tree using pictures, scanned images, movie clips, and music to add life to names and dates. Learn how to use Power Point to make the scrapbook, Corel Photo House to edit pictures and scanned images, and how to add sound clips and music to your presentation. You will then copy it to CD to share with others.

## About our speakers...

### **Larry Keddy**

Larry was born in Berwick, Nova Scotia. After graduating from Acadia University in 1950 he went on to obtain a Civil Engineering degree from the University of New Brunswick in 1957. He developed an interest in photography at an early age and fine tuned that interest throughout his life. He has training in fine art black and white photography, color photography and advanced darkroom procedures.

He is a Past President and Life Member of The Photographic Guild of Nova Scotia, and is a Past Vice-president of the Kings Historical Society and Kings County Museum. Larry has taught courses in photography, and gives seminars on preserving our photographic heritage. Larry owns and operates LARK PhotoGraphic Services specializing in photo restoration and graphic design. He and his wife, Ruth live in Kentville.

### **Karen White**

Karen was formerly the Archivist and Librarian for the Archdiocese of Halifax and had been an active member of the Council of Nova Scotia Archives since 1994. Her ample archival experience and familiarity with the CNSA combined with a M.L.I.S. from Dalhousie University make her a great choice for her new job as Education, Outreach and Network Archivist for the Council of Nova Scotia Archives.

### **Council of Nova Scotia Archives**

The (CNSA) is a professional organization for archives and archivists in Nova Scotia. The Council advocates the importance of archives, preservation of Nova Scotia's documentary heritage, and access to these records through our member institutions. A number of dedicated professional archivists, drawn from member institutions, occupy positions on our administrative committees. Through these committees, the CNSA fosters education of archival standards and practices that are key in the preservation of heritage for future generations. The CNSA endeavors to promote archival standards, procedures and practices among those institutions and organizations entrusted with the care of Nova Scotia's documentary heritage. Presently the CNSA staff consists of one professional archivist who facilitates educational programs, maintains on-line databases and travels to member institutions to provide on-site assistance.

### **Pauline MacLean**

Educated at Whycomagh Consolidated School and graduated in 1970, Pauline MacLean earned her diploma in Chemical Technology from NSEIT. Employed by the Highland Village since 1987 as Genealogy Coordinator, she has worked to develop the Roots Cape Breton program in conjunction with the Genealogy Committee of the Nova Scotia Highland Village. She has served on the Board of the Federation of Nova Scotian Heritage and is currently on the Board of the Council of Nova Scotia Archives, Lake Ainslie Historical Society, Iona Connection Co-operative and the Lake Ainslie Marathon Society. Pauline lives at East Lake Ainslie, Inverness County and is married with 2 children.

### **Dr. Paul B. Huber & Eva Maria Huber**

Paul Huber is a retired professor of economics at Dalhousie University in Halifax, Nova Scotia. One of his teaching and research interests is European Economic History. Eva Marie Huber is the president of Messenger Publications Inc.

### **Dr. Terrence M. Punch, FRSAI, CG(C)**

Terry Punch, genealogical and historical speaker and writer, has held office in several organizations, including the chair of the Royal Nova Scotia Historical Society, the Genealogical Association of Nova Scotia, and the Genealogical Institute of the Maritimes. He received the Phyllis Blakeley Lifetime Achievement in heritage. He is resident genealogist for CBC Maritime Noon, a live radio phone-in. He is author of *Genealogical Research in Nova Scotia* (4 editions), edited *Genealogist's Handbook for Atlantic Canada Research*, and writes regular columns for *Seniors' Advocate*, *Saltscapes*, and *Neuschottländer Bote*, and has twice won awards for historical writing from the Canadian Authors Association.
